The independent administration authority will be granted unless an interested person files an objection to the petition and shows good cause why the court should not grant the authority.

If you object to the granting of the petition, you should appear at the hearing and state your objections or file written objections with the court before the hearing. Your appearance may be in person or by your attorney.

If you are a creditor or a contingent creditor of the decedent, you must file your claim with the court and mail a copy to the personal representative appointed by the court within the later of either (1) four months from the date of first issuance of letters to a general personal representative, as defined in section 58(b) of the California Probate Code, or (2) 60 days from the date of mailing or personal delivery to you of a notice under section 9052 of the California Probate Code.

Other California statutes and legal authority may affect your rights as a creditor. You may want to consult with an attorney knowledgeable in California law.

You may examine the file kept by the court. If you are a person interested in the estate, you may file with the court a formal Request for Special Notice (FORM DE-154) of the filing of an inventory and appraisal of estate assets or of any petition or account as provided in Probate Code §1250. A Request for Special Notice form is available from the court clerk.

SONOMA COUNTY HISTORY

In 1930

Sonoma County's population was 62,000. Farms totaled 5,700 in 1920, increasing to 6,500 in 1930; the number of chickens was 3 million in 1920 increasing to 4.3 million in 1930.

The annual total of hops grown rose to 3 million pounds; the main hop years were 1880-1950.

Eleven Santa Rosa doctors and a druggist were arrested on charges of writing fraudulent prescriptions for "hot claret wine gargle."

Wesley Jamison led an agricultural education program at Santa Rosa High School until 1968, producing leaders of agricultural programs throughout the U.S.

Direct phone calls began to London, Australia and elsewhere at a high cost.
