NOTICE INVITING INTERESTED CONTRACTORS FOR THE 2015 INFORMAL BID LIST FOR SONOMA COUNTY JUNIOR COLLEGE DISTRICT

In accordance with the State of California Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Commission, the Sonoma County Junior College District ("District") is inviting all interested licensed contractors to submit their company for inclusion on the District's Informal Bidding Contractors List for calendar year 2015.

NOTE

You must resubmit to be included on the 2015 list even if your company has submitted an application in prior years.

Per California Public Contract Code 22032, any Public Works project that is estimated to be \$175,000 or less is subject to the Informal Bidding Procedures set forth by the State of California Uniform Construction Cost Accounting Commission. All trade categories are subject to Informal Bidding Procedures.

Contractors that are interested in being on the 2015 Informal Bidding Contractors List are required to have a current license and are subject to verification through the Contractors State License Board.

Additionally, pursuant to SB 854, no contractor or subcontractor may be listed on a bid for a public works project (submitted on or after March 1, 2015) unless registered with the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) and no contractor or subcontractor may be awarded a contract for a public works project (awarded on or after April 1, 2015) unless registered with the DIR per California Labor Code section 1725.5.

If you or your company would like to be placed on the District's 2015 Informal Bidding Contractors List, please complete the District's informal bidding prequalification application.

SONOMA COUNTY HISTORY

In 1964

A major fire threatened Santa Rosa and the east county from September 22-27; Thirty Sonoma Valley homes were destroyed. Huge floods occurred around Christmas.

The Poultry Producers Cooperative, active since 1916, filed for bankruptcy.

The Sonoma County Planning Commission approved rezoning for the upscale Sea Ranch development on the northwest Sonoma County coast on June 18th. Plans called for a 5,000-acre planned community. Environmentalists battled Sea Ranch developers over beach access. The Coastal Commission was created and an access compromise was worked out early in the 1980s.

PG&E withdrew its application to build a nuclear power plant at Bodega Head on October 30th.

The Hwy. 101 freeway opened through Healdsburg. Ignacio (Ig) Vella, of Sonoma's cheese-making company, became a "larger than life" member of the Sonoma County Board of Supervisors until 1975.

Fairfield Homes began construction of the Oakmont senior housing development between Santa Rosa and Sonoma. The project was annexed to the city of Santa Rosa.

SONOMA COUNTY HISTORY

In 1877

Sonoma County boasted between 43 and 60 churches, more than any other county except San Francisco.

Duncan's Mills was established by A. Duncan.

Robert A. Thompson published the first county history: "Historical Atlas of Sonoma County."

David Hetzel planted tobacco in west county, mainly for cigars.

Occidental's population hit 50 and rose to 97 in 1880.

Forestville boasted the first manufacturing plant in the county: the chair factory of Isaac Sullivan. Later, the durable chairs produced by Stewart Faudre became a major success.
